2017 OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD

MEETINGS & EVENTS

2017 Annual Meeting. The Midwest Poultry Consortium held its 2017 Annual Meeting at St. Paul's RiverCentre on Tuesday, March 14 in conjunction with the Midwest Poultry Federation's Annual Convention. MPC President Beth Nelson provided updates regarding MPC's budget, sponsors, board of directors, and staff. Nelson also gave an overview of the COE program which included a faculty update, as well as a review of the Poultry Leadership Experience. Chelsea Russell, MPC Student Director, gave a review of student recruitment efforts, 2017 scholarship information, internship updates, and student placement activities over the course of the past year.

Following the approval of the Secretary, Treasurer, and Nominating Committee reports, former COE student Max Pfund, employed with Herbruck's Poultry Ranch, spoke about his experience as a COE student. Mick Fulton of Michigan State University, and instructor of the Avian Health course at the COE, followed with a 'faculty perspective' of the COE. Concluding the meeting, Vice Chair Brian Joyer recognized Steve Jurek of GNP Company as MPC's Outstanding Service Award recipient.

Year-End Banquet Honors Largest COE Class of the Decade. Marking the end of its 22nd year of educating students in poultry science, MPC held its Center of Excellence Scholarship/Internship Program's (COE) year-end banquet and awards ceremony at *The Madison Concourse Hotel* to honor 2017's 36-member COE class – the second largest class ever for the program. The COE, an intense 12-week poultry science curriculum spread over the course of two summers, is intended to prepare students for employment within the poultry industry upon graduation. While extremely demanding, it provides students with the opportunity to earn up to 18 credits in poultry science, participate in internships paving the way for future employment within the industry, and develop a lifelong network of friends and associates.

The banquet included a social hour, dinner, and awards ceremony recognizing Mariah Huberty as the most dedicated student (*Ducks in a Row Award*), Hunter Wawers as class clown (*Yolkster Award*), and Emilee Copple as the most intelligent student (*Egghead Award*).

Scholarship Selection. Thirty-six students participated in the 2017 COE program, making it the largest class in over a decade. Ten students completed their second year, and all 14 of the Consortium's member schools were represented. COE STUDENT RECRUITMENT

Promoting COE and the Poultry Industry While Recruiting for the 2018 COE. The fall recruitment season for the 2018 COE class meant visits to our affiliated schools. In addition to attracting the best students to apply for the COE program, MPC puts a focus on increasing student awareness of opportunities within the poultry industry. We were happy to see the creation of new poultry classes and clubs, growing interest from students attending our industry events, and willingness of past COE students to be involved.

Poultry Panels. MPC conducted two large poultry networking events - North Dakota State University (NDSU) and South Dakota State University (SDSU) Poultry Panels.

Almost 115 students attended NDSU's 5th Annual Poultry Panel Networking Event on September 25. Panelists included: Marissa Garry, *Select Genetics*; Barry Koppen, *Purina*; Erin Thelander, *NDSU* (COE student); Matthew Walston, *Cargill*.

South Dakota State University's 3rd Annual Poultry Networking Event attracted over 150 students on October 3. SDSU panelists included: Denny Rowley, *Royal Flush Pheasants*; Chris Rude, *Devenish Nutrition*; Thomas Salentiny, *SDSU* (COE student); John Schleifer, *Rembrandt Foods*.

These events have become strong drivers in piquing student interest in careers in the poultry industry. Both panels were held the night before each university's respective Ag Career Fairs, driving increased traffic to MPC sponsor booths.

New Initiatives. The NDSU Animal Science department, encouraged by interest in the Poultry Panel, announced a NDSU Poultry Club was being created, headed by 2017 COE student Erin Thelander and advised by Alison Ward. Dr.

Ward is also creating a poultry course available to NDSU students in the spring of 2019. Also encouraged by high attendance at their poultry panels and the success of the SDSU Poultry Short-course, SDSU announced an Intro to Poultry Management course to be available to SDSU students in 2018.

Campus Club Involvement. MPC has worked to strengthen club involvement and give students a better idea of the job opportunities existing in the industry. MPC spoke at club meetings and was able to invite guest speakers from sponsor companies to highlight employment opportunities in the industry. At lowa State University (ISU), the club convened a special meeting to hear presentations from MPC staff, representatives from Sparboe Farms and Jennie-O Turkey Store, as well as ISU's new poultry physiologist, Dawn Koltes. In Illinois, the club heard from MPC staff and 2017 COE participant Luke Zimmerman. At Purdue, MPC staff and a Cooper Farms representative visited with students from the Poultry and

Meat Science Clubs. At Michigan State University (MSU) Angela Johnson, a 2013 COE graduate working with Pilgrim's, took time away from work to represent the COE program at her alma mater and to talk about careers within the industry at the MSU Poultry Club meeting, Pre-Career Gallery Networking Mixer, and Networking Breakfast. MPC staff spoke with the poultry club at the University of Minnesota. In Missouri, MPC was able to coordinate a special Block and Bridle/Pre-Vet Club meeting. Students heard from MPC staff and 2012 COE graduate Lorryn Bolte with Novus International. In Ohio, MPC coordinated an Industry Night meeting for the Poultry Club. MPC staff and 2017 COE participants talked about the COE experience, while Landon Brehm, a 2015 COE participant with Maple Leaf Farms and a representative from Gerber Poultry talked about jobs in the industry. At UW-Madison, students in the poultry club attended an industry night hearing from MPC staff and 2011 COE graduate Abigail Sielaff with Daybreak Foods. At the UW-River Falls poultry club, students heard from MPC staff as well as Marci Ricklick, a 2017 COE student.

Classroom Presentations and Career Fairs. MPC staff gave presentations in over 45 classes, and attended 11 career fairs at our affiliated schools. Twenty-five students helped in the classroom presentations and with staffing the career fair booths. This is important exposure for the poultry industry and is sometimes the only time a student hears about jobs within the poultry industry.
